Woolwich tax increase among highest of area municipalities

WOOLWICH'S PROPERTY TAX INCREASE THIS year is among the highest in southern Ontario, an Observer investigation reveals.

The municipality last month approved a hike of 8.7 per cent for the township portion of residents' bills, which represents an additional \$93 extra for the average household.

Among 45 municipalities in the Greater Golden Horseshoe area that The Observer examined, the only councils that raised their rates by more were nearby Wilmot at 10.8 per cent, Toronto at 9.5 per cent, and Halton Hills at nine per cent.

By comparison, Barrie froze the city portion of its property tax rate, Clarington's increase was just 1.5 per cent and Mississauga's was 2.3 per cent.

The average increase among the 45 municipalities was 5.2 per cent, which is still almost double the annual inflation rate, which currently stands at 2.9 per cent and is expected to fall.

The ten highest rate increases among those examined are listed below along with the average bills their residents can now expect to pay this year:

Only three of Waterloo Region's seven municipalities increased their rate by less than the 5.2 per cent average: North Dumfries at 4.2 per cent, Kitchener at 3.9 per cent and Wellesley at 3.6 per cent.

In Woolwich, property tax bills are based on three separate charges, which are percentages levied against the assessed value of homes, which is called a mill rate.

Wellesley designates a stretch of Maplewood Rd. as community safety zone

RESIDENTS OF MAPLEWOOD ROAD SOUTH of St. Clements can expect to see some traffic-calming measures now that Wellesley council is on board.

Meeting Tuesday night, councillors voted unanimously to designate a portion of the road as a community safety zone. The stretch will run from 415 metres south of Hessen Strasse to 650 metres north of Weimar Line.

Paradise Lake resident Caressa Madison addressed councillors about speeding on the road, a problem described in a staff report recommending the township take action.

"Over the years, I know many of my neighbours have also reached out about their concerns regarding speeding on Maplewood," said Madison, who has lived on the street for nearly 30 years.

"Since the south end of Maplewood was paved a number of years ago, it has become quite a thoroughfare and because we have no sidewalks, trails, bike lanes or even shoulders for most of the road, it can be quite dangerous when a car is
